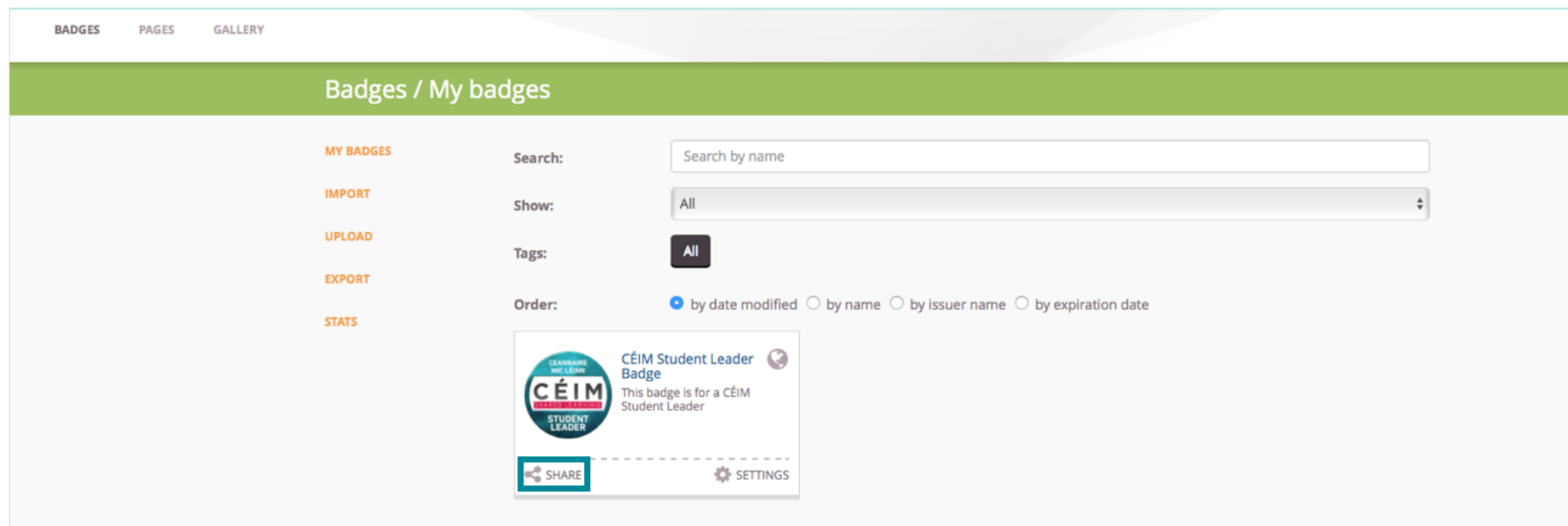


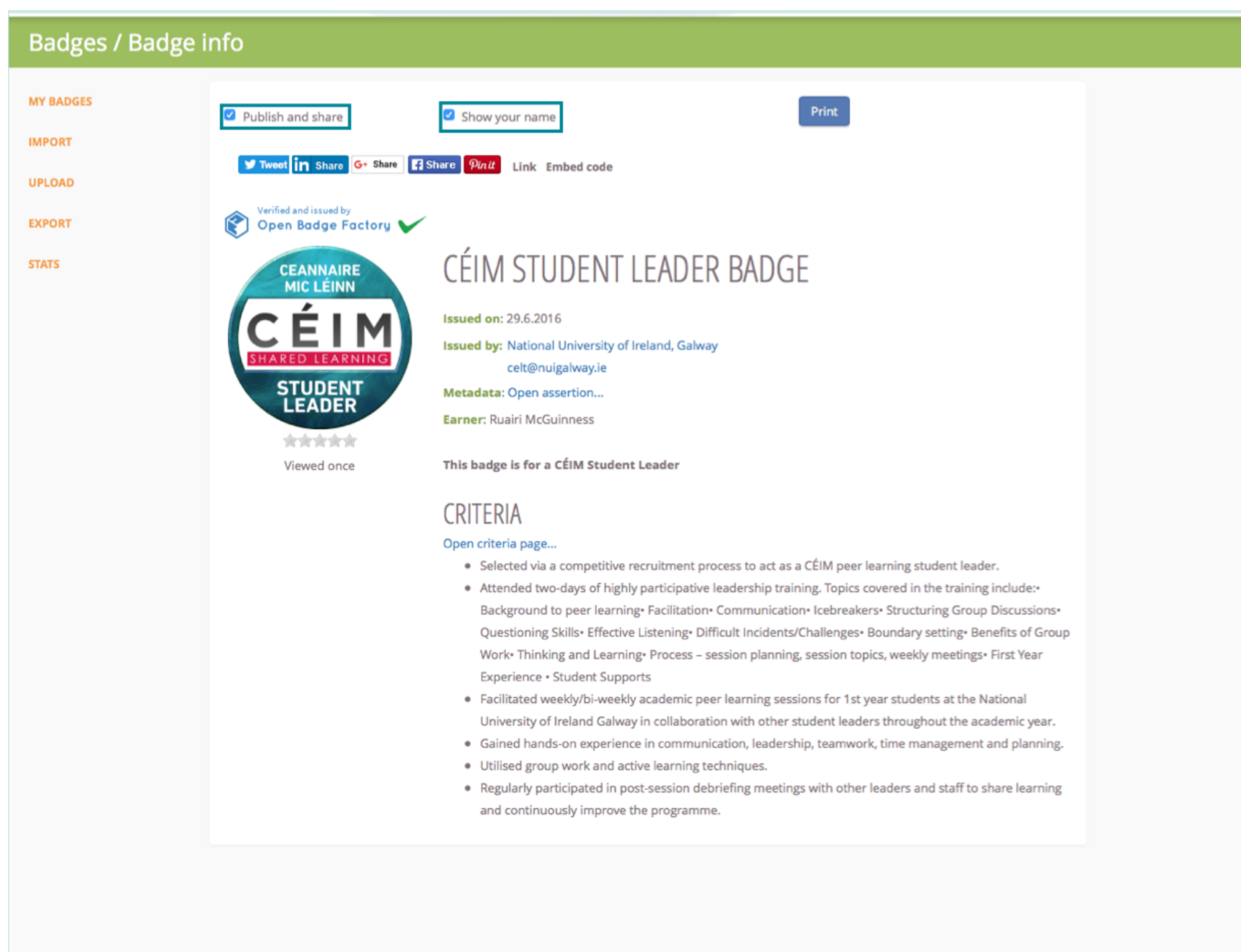
Redeeming your badge: Linking with LinkedIn

Your digital badged can be shared on a wide variety of social media sites. Here's how you can share your badges with others on LinkedIn.

Click 'Share' on the badge you wish to show off.



You should be brought to this screen. Be sure to check the box marked 'Publish and share', and the one marked 'Show your name'.



You can share and showcase your badge on a number of different sites, but for now, let's go through sharing it on linkedIn.

To display your badge on your LinkedIn Profile:

Go to the badge share page on your Digital Badge Passport.

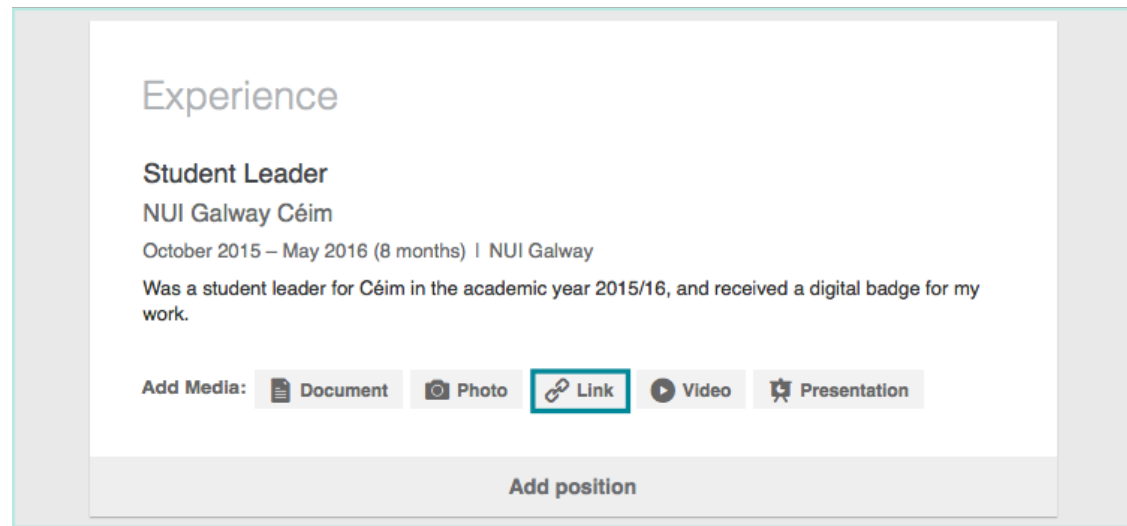

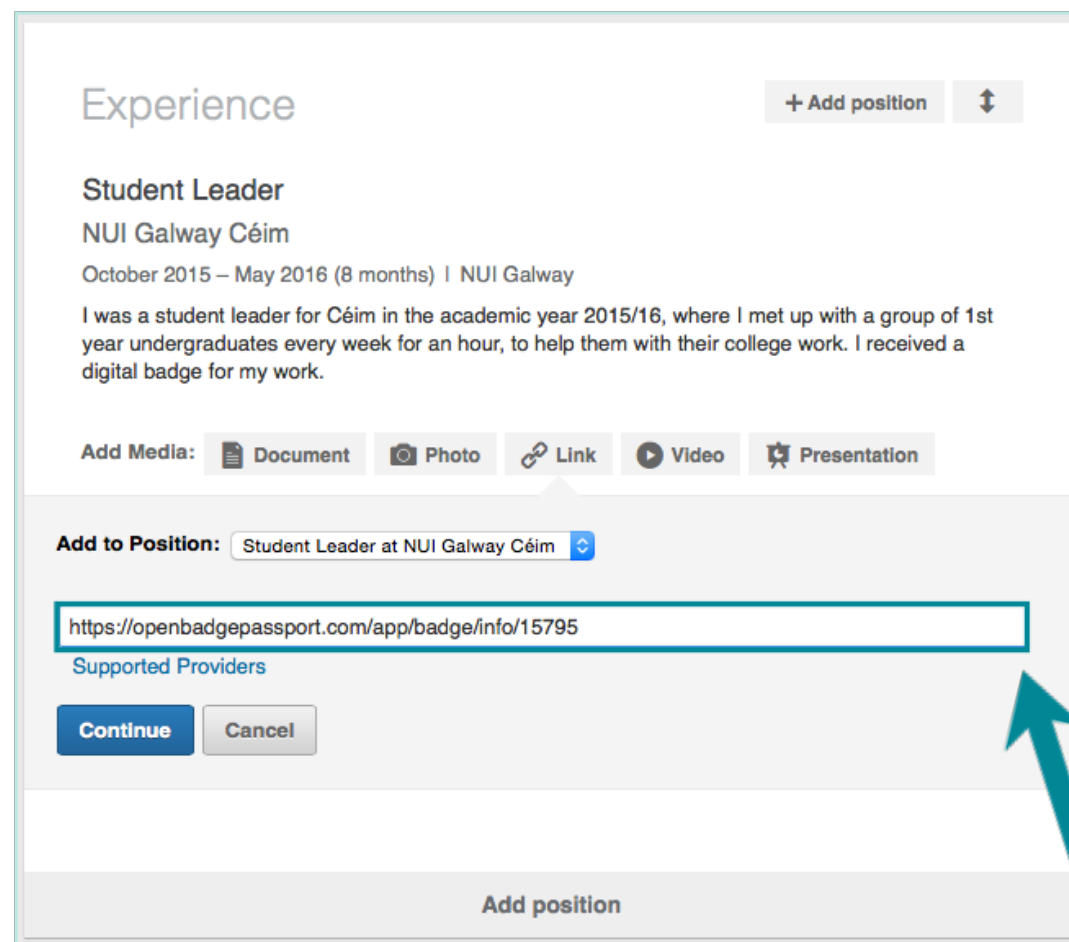
2. Edit your LinkedIn profile. Add a section and choose the 'Experience' section.

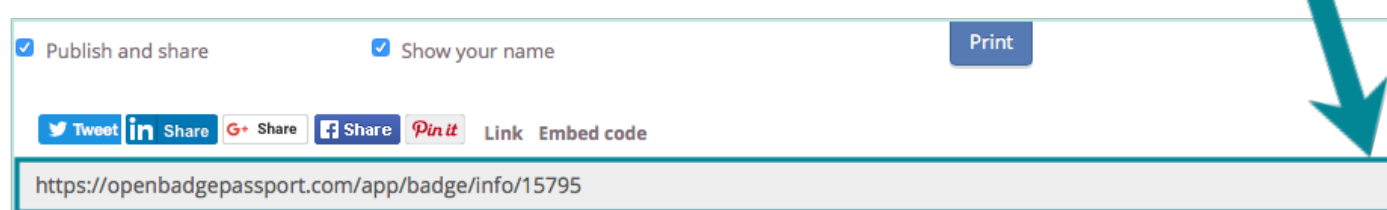
3. After filling out the 'Experience' section with details of your work, you will get something like this:



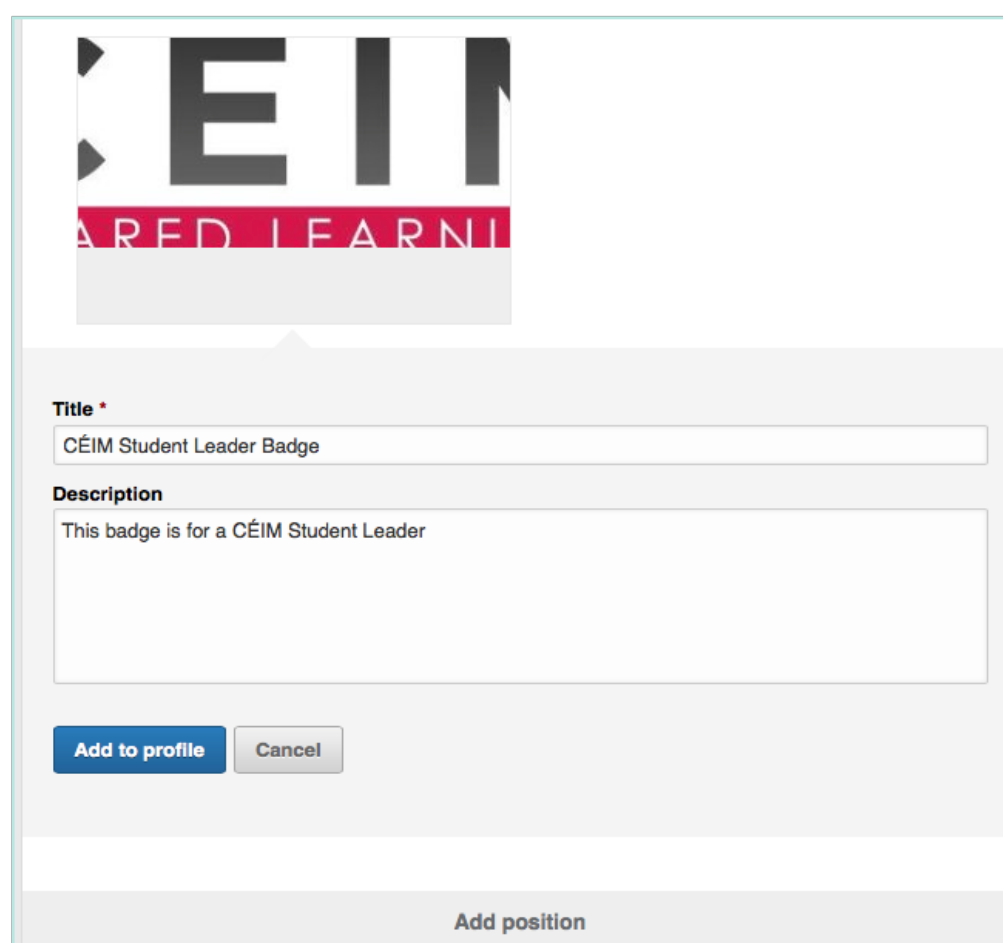
Under 'Add Media', click the 'Link' button. A box, allowing you to enter a URL will show up.

You can personalise this message if you wish.




Your badge will now be displayed on your LinkedIn profile, for all the world to see.
